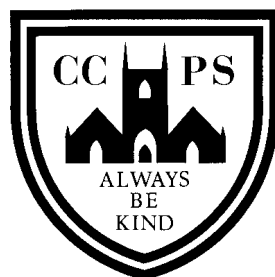

Supply costs for Subject Leader Time or sports events	£2000	Supply costs have allowed AH to have subject leader release time, attend Subject Leader Network meetings as well as Move More competitions and events. This has enabled more children to take part in more inter-school competitions along with a broader range of sporting opportunities. Release time or extra hours have also allowed for subject leadership time and organisation of enrichment days.

ASA Swimming Teacher Course (including over time and supply hours)	£708	KP, LD & SB attended a 2-day swimming instructor course organised by Move More. This will increase our ability to teach swimming within the school, allowing more children access to quality swimming instruction. This will lessen our reliance on external providers meaning we can make more use of CLC pool, in turn using less curriculum time to cover swimming outcomes.

Bee Netball Training and resources	£234	AH & JC attended Bee Netball training hosted by England Netball to enable children to play the new junior netball programme. Activity cards purchased to improve lessons across all key stages.
5 Ways to Well-Being Course by Gloucester Rugby Club	£400	Year 4 children took part in a 6-week programme based around well-being and taught through the medium of physical activity. By the end of the programme, children could talk about aspects of well-being and ways to improve their own physical and mental well-being. There was also a marked improvement in the behaviour of the class over the 6 weeks.
Sporting Enrichment Days Quidditch Jamie McDonald Fencing	£1900	<p>Quidditch days allowed all KS1 & 2 children to build on taster session held last year. All children were very active throughout the sessions and every KS2 child went on to take part in a house tournament the following day.</p> <p>All children met, ultra-endurance runner and Pride of Britain winner, Jamie McDonald. They were inspired by his charitable work, incredible perseverance and the difficulties he had overcome as a child.</p> <p>Fencing day allowed all children to experience a new sport, being active throughout the session. At least one child has now joined a fencing club outside of school.</p>
Equipment	£2000	<p>Equipment purchased to increase the quality and engagement in PE lessons and clubs. This has ensured that there is adequate equipment to ensure all children can be actively participating for as long as possible in every lesson.</p> <p>Equipment has included but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Athletics equipment • Netballs • Dance Scheme of work • Tennis nets and balls • Outdoor Clock

Active Lunchtimes	£4866	<p>Lunchtimes have been invested in to increase activity levels and improve behaviour. Some of this money was used for extra Midday Supervisors to lead activity sessions such as football, skipping games and circuit sessions.</p> <p>Other costs included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lunchtime play equipment • Midday supervisor hours to run play leader sessions with children
Forest School Equipment	£648	This has enabled children to attend Forest School sessions where they take part in 'Active Learning'. A love of the outdoors and being physically active is promoted throughout the lessons.
Staff and pupil branded clothing	£1112	Staff hoodies and polo shirts. Easier identification of staff by pupils at sporting events. Children's hoodies for events to allow easier identification of children when at interschool event. School now holds stock for future staff and replacements as needed.
