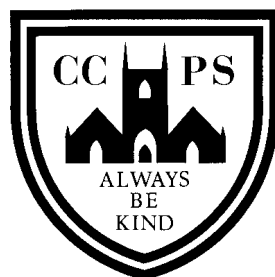

Move More Health Membership Package	£2300	<p>Health Activator worked with targeted children to help with their engagement in both school life and physical activities.</p> <p>Targeted KS1 children received support in playing 'active playground games' and learning to cope with winning and losing. A reduction in playground arguments is beginning to be seen.</p> <p>Reception children received Balanceability training. All children confident on balance bikes by the end of the ten-week course.</p>

		<p>Yr1 received lessons in the importance of being fit and active and the effects of exercise on their bodies. Children were able to describe some of the positive effects of exercise in simple terms.</p> <p>Yr4&5 received lessons aimed at understanding aspects of mental health and the importance of communication with other individuals. Children were able to talk more freely about their emotions and the affects that other could have on their emotions both positively and negatively.</p> <p>Lunchtime 'Chill Out' club was run for children in Yr4. Children described this as being 'a time they could talk to someone about important things in life.'</p> <p>After school multi skills club for reception and KS1 children was successful in getting an increased number of younger children involved in physical activity clubs with around 20 children attending on a weekly basis during terms 2 & 4.</p>
<p>Move More Bolt-on FunFit Sessions 6 weeks</p>	<p>£480</p>	<p><u>Autumn Term 2</u> Yr3 whole class Targeted chn from Yr4-6 Children took part in strenuous activity sessions and learnt that being out of breath, with an increased heart rate was normal. They began to understand the importance of exercise on different aspects of their bodies. Over the 6 weeks some children were able to say that they felt benefits and were enjoying the exercise more.</p>
<p>Supply costs for Subject Leader Time or sports events</p>	<p>£3500</p>	<p>Supply costs have allowed AH to attend Subject Leader Network meetings as well as Move More competitions and events. This has enabled more children to take part in more inter-school competitions along with a broader range of sporting opportunities.</p>

They embraced that it is our differences that make us all unique and give us all individual talents. Children took on challenges in climbing which every child achieved. Quidditch inspired children to make up their own games and use their imaginations to stay physically active. Children have been creating own games on the playground.</p> <p>Year 4 children attended a 2 hour gymnastics session at Rowan Gym Club. They experienced a sprung floor and gymnastic equipment not available in school. Many children are already part of the gym club run at school and this experience is hoped to keep their enthusiasm for gym and encourage them to join clubs beyond that offered at school.</p>
<p>Equipment</p>	<p>£3879</p>	<p>Equipment purchased to increase the quality and engagement in PE lessons and clubs. This has ensured that there is adequate equipment to ensure all children can be actively participating for as long as possible in every lesson.</p> <p>Equipment has included but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Crash mat, Gymnastics spring board, balance beams, leotards. • Netball posts, hockey sticks, balls • Pedometers • Playground equipment • Footballs • Storage boxes for equipment in PE cupboard <p>The investment in gymnastics equipment in particular has seen a large number of children now attending gym club after school resulting in competitive performances at the key steps gymnastics competitions where several children won medals.</p> <p>Investment in playground equipment has increased physical activity during lunchtimes.</p>

Balanceability bikes and training	£1777	Bikes and helmets, along with balance equipment purchased to add to existing equipment in school. Following training course (4/10/19) 2 members of staff will be trained and able to run Balanceability training in school for Reception and Year 1 children. This will reduce the school's reliance on external providers and mean that session can be run throughout the year to meet the needs of the children.
Forest School	£1500	RW trained as Forest Schools leader. This has enabled children to attend Forest School sessions where they take part in 'Active Learning'. A love of the outdoors and being physically active is promoted throughout the lessons.
ASA Swimming Teacher Course	£235	CW attended a 2 day swimming instructor course organised by Move More. This will increase our ability to teach swimming within the school, allowing more children access to quality swimming instruction. This will lessen our reliance on external providers meaning we can make more use of CLC pool, in turn using less curriculum time to cover swimming outcomes.
Transport to sporting events.	£122	Taxis to netball tournaments at Chosen Hill School. Taxi to Archery at Balcarras School.
Staff clothing	£300	Staff hoodies and polo shirts. Easier identification of staff by pupils at sporting events.
