

Christ Church C of E Primary School - Primary PE and Sport Funding Spending Plan 2016 - 2017

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11), as recorded in the annual schools census in January. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. **Our school will receive £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per child each year.**

The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The money will be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability. For example, this will include:

- Training teachers to improve the quality of sports lessons.
- Invest in quality coaching.
- Offer more after school clubs.
- Provide more opportunities for pupils to take part in inter-school competitions.
- Purchase better equipment.
- Introduce new and unusual sports.
