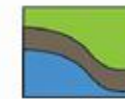

Physical features - things that occur naturally like seas, cliffs, hills and valleys.



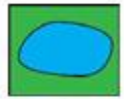

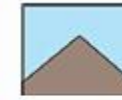

Human features - things made by humans like cities, houses, roads, ports, farms and factories.



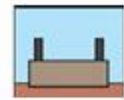

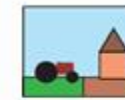

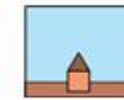
