Yoga sessions and staff CPD	£960.00	The introduction of yoga sessions, funded by the Primary PE and Sport Premium, has had a measurable impact across the school. All staff involved in delivering or supporting these sessions have gained increased confidence, knowledge, and practical skills in teaching PE, particularly in relation to mindfulness, flexibility, and core strength. CPD opportunities and teacher modelling from qualified instructors have empowered staff to integrate yoga techniques into broader PE lessons and classroom routines.  Pupils have benefitted from a broader experience of physical activity beyond traditional team sports. Yoga has introduced them to		

		<p>an inclusive, accessible form of exercise that promotes not only physical well-being but also emotional regulation, concentration, and self-awareness. These benefits have been particularly valuable for children who may not engage as confidently in competitive sports.</p> <p>The visibility of yoga across the school has raised the profile of PE and sport, highlighting its role in supporting whole-school improvement. Yoga has been embedded into wellbeing initiatives, behaviour support strategies, and classroom brain breaks, demonstrating the wider value of physical activity in supporting mental health, focus, and readiness to learn.</p> <p>Indicators 2, 4 &amp; 5</p>
Skate and scooter workshops	£360.00	<p>Core strength, balance and coordination development across all year groups. Children were able to overcome any fear or hesitation when trying a new activity. Accessible to all abilities and an urban sport - alternative to mainstream sports. Outdoor Physical Activity Trail	£4921.06	<p>The installation of a fixed outdoor physical activity trail is designed to enhance pupils' physical literacy, coordination, and gross motor skills through structured and unstructured active play. This equipment provides sustainable, long-term support for daily physical activity, contributing to Christ Church's aim of increasing engagement in sport and promoting healthy lifestyles. The trail will be used during PE lessons to develop fundamental movement skills such as balance, agility, and climbing, and will also be accessible during break times to encourage active play. It supports the school's commitment to embedding physical activity into the school day and complements existing PE provision. This investment aligns with the DfE's Sports Premium guidance by offering inclusive, accessible opportunities for all pupils to be physically active, and by creating a lasting resource that will benefit current and future cohorts.</p> <p>Indicators 2,3,4</p>
