High profile of these sessions being run in school has resulted in our CCPS All Stars Cricket Club run by GCF, being heavily oversubscribed.

The children received coaching in a sport that was new to many and accessible to many through local parks and low cost of scooters. Opportunity to inspire and engage children in new sport/activity.
